## **ODAIKO** "BIG DRUM" – A BASIC ARRANGEMENT

The *Odaiko* style refers to the playing style where the drum is on a high stand and played in the staning position. It is a form of taiko where both ends of te drum are played, and by more then one player. *Odaiko* also usually refers to the largest drum in a troupe, but also a class of drums larger than the standard *chudaiko*. Some Odaiko can be truly enormous, like Kodo's 6-foot diameter, 700 kilogram monster.

## SIMPLE ARRANGEMENT FOR SHANGÖ YAMA TAIKO

For our very basic version, after an introductorly Prelude, we'll stick with a "straight" *jiuchi*, and a series of improvosational solos with players alternating out, then a Finale. This diagam shows six players, but of course could be done with more or less players, or more swich-outs.

<b>Player One</b> - Plays a prelude/intro. Individual Player Sequence: Swap in > Jiuchi > Solo > Jiuchi > Swap out

Choreography - Swap in and out of the *jiuchi* while the player at the other end is soloing.

Take the place of the player playing the *jiuchi* and *continue the jiuchi*. When they finish their solo, Then play your solo. While you're playing the solo, someone will swap in playing the *jiuchi* on the other side. Finish your solo, then switch back to the *jiuchi*. The other player will start their solo, then swap out for the next *jiuchi* player. Rinse and repeat.
